mentions "ChildLine" a UK nonprofit that helps youth deal with online shaming

TED Talk "The Price of Shame"

a "culture of humiliation"

TMZ, gossip websites, politics

these groups PROFIT off of other's embarrassment

believes that we need a "cultural revolution"

support orgs that are a supporting friendly positive online environments

connects cyberbullying to actual bullies

personal experience of author

believed the bully would only wanted to attract attention (and same can be said for cyberbullying)

cyberbullying

online harassment/shaming

fueled by today's social media craze

if someone does not agree with us we do not acknowledge them

easier than normal bullying because it is difficult for people to imagine ever meeting up with them in person

Justine Sacco

tweeted "Going to Africa. Hope I don't get AIDS. Just kidding. I'm white!"

a joke criticizing white privilege and our tendency to naively imagine ourselves immune from life's horrors

people had taken her literally and labeled the tweet as a racist comment from a racist person
